I recently taught a junior/senior level course on Chaos and Fractals. One of my goals in the course was to have my students understand how a mathematician thinks. To meet this goal, I had them read and present recently published dynamical systems articles (many of them since 2000). I chose the articles from Pi Mu Epsilon and the MAA journals, where papers are often co-written by undergraduates. I allowed the students to pick from a selection of articles. Each pair of students was given an entire class period to present their paper and was required to incorporate some technology into their presentation. In this talk, I will discuss the specifics of the project and discuss ways of adapting this idea to other upper level courses. (Received October 03, 2004)
