Traditionally, the Islamic calendar is based on the first visibility of the crescent Moon. However, this is obviously not a very practical method. A number of prediction based methods have been developed over the years. The goal of this talk is to discuss how the Islamic calendar is currently implemented in different countries. This is not always easy to tell. Many Islamic communities claim to follow observations, but in reality they follow predictions.
