Every mathematics teacher is aware that a good way to enliven a math class is to include a lively biography of a mathematician. A little-known, entertaining story, which can be inserted easily in any undergraduate course, is that of Gerbert, the mathematician and pope, who in 967 a.d. travelled across the Pyrennees to study mathematics in the Islamic civilization of Moorish Spain.
