From January 1915 to July 1916 the Cambridge mathematics student F. P. White kept a diary in which he freely recorded details of his daily life. During this period White came top in the Mathematical Tripos, embarked on postgraduate research in applied mathematics, and appeared in front of several Appeal Tribunals as a conscientious objector. White's diary not only provides a vivid description of Cambridge mathematical life during the First World War but also gives an insight into the pacifist movement and the mathematicians who supported it.
