Developing mnemonic devices in conjunction with Ausubelian concept mapping techniques can produce an effective tool to solve probability problems using "and/or" problems. Although this technique is helpful for undergraduate students, it may be used with secondary level students too. A mnemonic device such as "Paid Poon"- developed by Hamid-constructed with the aid of concept mapping is proven to be a powerful tool in improving problem solving skills in probability theory.
