For non-trivial Heyting algebras H_1, H_2 one always has at least one homomorphism $H_1 \rightarrow H_2$; if $H_1 = H_2$ there is at least one non-identical one. A Heyting algebra H is *almost rigid* if $|\text{End}(H)| = 2$ and a system of almost rigid algebras \mathcal{H} is said to be *discrete* if $|\text{Hom}(H_1, H_2)| = 1$ for any two distinct $H_1, H_2 \in \mathcal{H}$. We show that there exists a discrete system of 2^ω countable almost rigid Heyting algebras. Background and motivation leading to this result will also be discussed. (Received July 19, 2005)
