Let $E \subset \mathbb{R}^n$ be a set of finite perimeter; that is, the characteristic function of E is a BV function. The now classical result of DeGiorgi-Federer states that

$$\int_E \div F \, dx = \int_{\partial^* E} F \cdot \nu \, dH^{n-1}$$

where $F : \mathbb{R}^n \to \mathbb{R}^n$ is Lipschitz and where $\nu(y)$ is the measure-theoretic normal to E at y. We will discuss the material related to and surrounding the following result:

Theorem Let $F \in L^{\infty}(\mathbb{R}^n, \mathbb{R}^n)$ be a field whose divergence is a measure, μ , and let E be a bounded set of finite perimeter. Then, there exists an H^{N-1} -integrable function $F_{tr} \in L^{\infty}(\partial^* E)$, called the normal trace, such that

$$\mu(E) = \int_E \div F = \int_{\partial^* E} F_{\rm tr}(y) \cdot \nu(y) \, dH^{N-1}(y).$$

Moreover, $||F_{rm-tr}||_{\infty} \leq ||F||_{\infty}$. (Received August 19, 2005)
