This talk will focus on the work of Guarino Guarini: a priest, mathematician and architect of the 1600's, who designed many buildings in Turin, Italy and other European cities. As a mathematician, Guarini studied and wrote about geometry, and then he applied his knowledge to architecture. He is especially known for the use of curvature and projection, and his buildings served as a model for future architects.
