We discuss the forward indifference valuation of American options in general incomplete diffusion markets. Under a general forward performance criterion, we formulate the option holder's valuation problem as a combined stochastic control and optimal stopping problem. This leads to the analytic and numerical studies of the associated variational inequality. We examine two specific financial applications: the valuation of American options under stochastic volatility, and the modeling of early exercises of American-style employee stock options. We also show that the marginal forward indifference price is independent of the investor's wealth and risk preferences, and is represented as the claim's risk-neutral price under the minimal martingale measure.
