I will discuss the use of coercive linear functionals in deducing existence results for fractional differential equations with nonlocal boundary conditions. As a specific example of this methodology, I will consider the fractional boundary value problem

$$- [D_{0^+}^{\nu} y](t) = \lambda f(t, y(t)), \ 0 < t < 1$$
$$y^{(i)}(0) = 0, \ 0 \le i \le n - 2$$
$$[D_{0^+}^{\alpha} y](1) = H(\varphi(y)),$$

where $n \in \mathbb{N}_4$, $n-1 < \nu \leq n$, $\alpha \in [1, n-2]$, and $\lambda > 0$ is a parameter. I will demonstrate that by utilizing a new order cone, one can generate existence results with minimal assumptions on the functions f and H. (Received August 04, 2016)
