The theory of Riemann–Hilbert problems is a powerful tool of nonlinear analysis. It gives detailed asymptotic expansions and high-accuracy numerics for many problems in integrable systems and random matrix theory. In this talk I will discuss some new applications of the method and, in particular, discuss its application to the statistical behavior of the conjugate gradient algorithm.
