Kronecker said, "God made the integers, all else is the work of man." By asking questions such as "Who invented function notation?" and "Why do we write exponents the way we do?" we begin to see how mathematicians shaped college algebra into what it is today. We also see that math itself is always evolving and that doing algebra means more than manipulating symbols.
