THE FEBRUARY MEETING IN NEW YORK

The five hundred fifty-fourth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at Columbia University in New York City on Saturday, February 28, 1959. About 250 persons attended.

Professor John Nash of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology addressed the Society on the subject An unorthodox view of the Riemann hypothesis in response to an invitation by the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings. Professor H. N. Shapiro introduced the speaker.
