THE APRIL MEETING IN STANFORD

The six hundred twenty-third meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, April 24, 1965 at Stanford University, Stanford, California. There were 205 registrants at this meeting, 162 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, hour addresses were given by Professor Harvey Cohn of the University of Arizona, and by Professor E. G. Straus of the University of California, Los Angeles. The title of Professor Cohn's talk was Some elementary aspects of modular functions in several variables. Professor D. H. Lehmer introduced Professor Cohn. Professor I. I. Hirschman, Jr. introduced Professor Straus, who talked on the Arithmetic of analytic functions.
