

THE FEBRUARY MEETING IN NEW YORK

The six hundred thirty-first meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on the Washington Square Campus of New York University at the Courant Institute of Mathematical Sciences. The Sessions were in the new Warren Weaver Hall. About 70 persons attended, including 58 members of the Society.
