THE OCTOBER MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE

The six hundred forty-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts, on Saturday, October 28, 1967. About 125 persons attended, including 112 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings, there were two invited addresses. Professor Edgar H. Brown of Brandeis University spoke on *Cobordism* groups; he was introduced by Professor G. W. Whitehead. Professor Arthur P. Mattuck of M.I.T. spoke on *Point cycles on algebraic* varieties; he was introduced by Professor O. Zariski.

There were four sessions for twenty-seven contributed papers, chaired by Professors J. A. Clarkson, D. Gorenstein, L. H. Loomis and G. E. Sacks.
