THE APRIL MEETING IN DAVIS

The six hundred seventy-fifth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the University of California, Davis, in Davis, California, on Saturday, April 25, 1970. There were 90 registrants at the meeting, including 76 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, there were two invited hour addresses at this meeting. Professor David Blackwell of the University of California at Berkeley presented a lecture entitled Ordinal solutions of G_b games. He was introduced by Professor H. L. Adler. Professor Ramesh Gangolli of the University of Washington presented the second hour address. The title of his talk was Aspects of the theory of spherical functions on symmetric spaces. Professor Calvin Moore introduced Professor Gangolli's lecture.

There were five sessions for contributed ten minute papers with Professors D. O. Banks, D. C. Benson, Earl Lymela, Robert Stringall, and Takayuki Tamura presiding.
