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Supersonic and transonic shock reflection.

We give a survey of recent progress on shock reflection. We discuss several subtle problems: the transition from regular to Mach reflection, the question of weak versus strong reflected shocks, and the proper posing of boundary/far-field conditions for uniqueness and existence discussions. We present techniques for rigorous construction or non-existence proofs of particular flows. (Received August 30, 2009)
