

BIG Career Booth: Information for Exhibitors
January 16 – 19, 2019, Joint Mathematics Meetings, Baltimore, Maryland

The BIG Career Booth provides a physical space in the exhibit area of the Joint Mathematics Meetings for exchange between:

- business, industry, and government employers of mathematically-trained individuals
- those inquiring about career opportunities in the exhibitors' organizations

The largest mathematics meeting in the world, JMM incorporates a multi-day exhibit area in the Baltimore Convention Center. Industry representatives signed up for time slots at the BIG Career Booth can network and provide information about their organizations. They will find:

- Talented, energetic, in-training and experienced mathematical scientists
- Opportunities to ask for resumes and distribute business cards and other information
- A centrally-located, turnkey venue in the exhibit area
- Traffic from the anticipated 6,000 JMM attendees

Space in the BIG Career Booth is provided in specified time slots, as shown in the table. Tables for two simultaneous exhibitors will be provided.

Employers may reserve slots of duration in 1 hour increments, except for the slightly extended time 12:15 – 1:30 on Wednesday.

The booth will be staffed by AMS staff and volunteer personnel. Exhibitors may wish to bring small-footprint signage or a customized tablecloth for the slots in which they are scheduled; they may bring printed materials to display at the booth throughout the exhibit times.

Those already planning to attend JMM and those working in the Baltimore/Washington area may be especially interested in this opportunity.

The cost is \$100/hr; the period 12:15 – 1:30 on Wednesday is counted as 1 hour.
