A positive integer n is called a practical number if every smaller positive integer is a sum of distinct divisors of n. Practical numbers are useful in proving Egyptian fraction theorem. In this talk we shall give several new properties of practical numbers and identify some new practical numbers. This in turn gives us a new proof of the Egyptina fraction theorem.
