For sets  $A, S \subseteq \mathbb{R}^2$  we say that S is a Steinhaus set for A if S meets every isometric copy of A at exactly one point. It has been conjectured that if A is finite with at least two elements then no Steihaus sets exist for A. I will give a survey of the known instances of the conjecture. Also the problem can be considered in  $\mathbb{R}$ , where the solutions are sometimes different. The talk is based on a joint paper with Miller and Weiss and on recent work of Xuan.
