In 2000, Ambrosio and Kirchheim defined currents in metric spaces, generalizing the earlier theory of Federer and Fleming in \mathbb{R}^n . Around the same time, Cheeger showed that a large class of spaces admit a generalized form of Rademacher's differentiation theorem.
