THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN CLAREMONT

The six hundred seventieth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the Claremont Graduate School in Claremont, California on Saturday, November 22, 1969. There were 92 registrants at the meeting, 61 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, there were two invited hour addresses presented at the meeting.
