THE JUNE MEETING IN TACOMA

The six hundred seventy-sixth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington, on Saturday, June 20, 1970. There were 121 registrants including 73 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, there were two invited hour addresses at this meeting. Professor Robert C. James of the Claremont Graduate School presented a talk entitled *Geometry of normed linear* spaces. He was introduced by Professor T. G. Ostrom. Professor Charles J. Stone of the University of California, Los Angeles, lectured on *Infinitely divisible processes and their potential theory*. He was introduced by Professor R. S. Pierce.

There were four sessions of contributed ten minute papers with Professors G. L. Coats, W. L. Johnson, John Koehler, and Lior Tzafriri presiding.
