THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN ATHENS

The six hundred seventy-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia, on Friday and Saturday, November 20–21, 1970. There were 351 registrants at this meeting, 285 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for the Southeastern Sectional Meetings, three hour addresses were given. Professor Erik Hemmingsen of Syracuse University presented Light open maps on n-manifolds, Professor Karl H. Hofmann of Tulane University spoke of Representations of algebras by continuous sections, and Professor Ernest E. Shult of the University of Florida addressed the group on Recent results on doubly transitive groups.
