

THE OCTOBER MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE

The five hundred sixtieth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology on October 31, 1959. About 200 persons attended including 183 members of the Society.

Professor G. A. Hunt of Cornell University addressed the Society on *Some recent developments in Markoff processes* by invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings. Professor J. G. Kemeny introduced the speaker.

There were six sessions for contributed papers. The presiding officers were Professor R. H. Crowell, Dr. G. F. Feeman, Professors I. S. Gál, A. T. James, J. H. Roberts, Hartley Rogers, Jr., and Mr. J. L. Selfridge.
