

THE OCTOBER MEETING IN NEW YORK

The six hundred fourth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn on Saturday, October 26, 1963. There were 132 registrants at this meeting, 121 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings there were two addresses. In the morning, Professor Jean Pierre Kahane of the University of Paris and the Institute for Advanced Study spoke on *Lacunary Taylor and Fourier series*. Professor Melvin Henriksen introduced the speaker.

In the afternoon, Professor André Haefliger of the University of Geneva and Columbia University spoke on *Smoothing combinatorial manifolds*. He was introduced by Professor H. E. Rauch.

There were four sessions for contributed papers at which twenty-two papers were presented. Presiding were Professors T. F. Cope, George Garrison, J. S. Lomont, and L. A. MacColl.
