

THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN ATLANTA

The seven hundred ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta, Georgia, on Friday and Saturday, November 16–17, 1973. There were 503 registrations including 393 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for the Southeastern Sectional Meetings, hour addresses were given by Ben Fitzpatrick, Jr. of Auburn University, Paul D. Hill of Florida State University, and M. Zuhair Nashed of Georgia Tech. Professor L. P. Burton introduced Professor Fitzpatrick who talked about *Moore spaces*. Professor John Neuberger introduced Professor Nashed who talked about *Regularization and numerical analysis of ill-posed operator equations*, and Professor R. W. Ball introduced Professor Hill who spoke about *Commutative groups and the cardinal connection*.

There were two special sessions on Friday at 2:15 P.M. The first session on Graph Theory was chaired by Professor M. D. Plummer of Vanderbilt University. The other special session on Friday on Applications of Ordinary Differential Equations was chaired by Professor John W. Heidel of the University of Tennessee. In addition to the special sessions eight sessions for contributed papers were chaired by Professors R. W. Ball, P. M. Gibson, W. H. Hare, R. H. Kasriel, A. Lelek, C. W. McArthur, J. R. Quine, and E. C. Young.

At 10:15 A.M. on Saturday the second half of the special session on Graph Theory chaired by M. D. Plummer and the second half of the special session on Applications of Ordinary Differential Equations were held. There were also eight sessions for contributed papers held on Saturday at 10:15 A.M. chaired by Professors R. D. Carmichael, H. S. Finkelstein, B. Fitzpatrick, Jr., C. Hunter, G. Johnson, J. A. Reneke, K. N. Sigmon, and D. P. Yeager.

There was a dutch treat beer party on Friday evening. Professor James V. Herod was in charge of local arrangements.
